The Air and Missile Warfare Programme of Legal Education – AMPLE

These courses provide expert instruction on all the legal aspects of the conduct of Air and Missile Warfare and are an integral part of the GCSP's Security and Law Programme

The contemporary law relating to the conduct of air and missile warfare has recently been reviewed by a distinguished panel of legal and operational experts and an Air and Missile Warfare Manual published for use by all those responsible for relevant operations.

As a follow-on to the Manual's publication, a team of experts – all of whom were involved in the drafting of the Manual – are available to deliver two or three day tailored courses to groups of military professionals (either operators or military lawyers).

The Geneva Centre for Security Policy is organizing the programme and will be delighted to hear from any nations or institutions that are considering taking advantage of the courses.

Background

The Geneva Centre for Security Policy is responsible for coordinating and arranging a series of short courses designed to provide air and missile warfare specialists – both operators and legal advisers – with up to date and topical training to ensure compliance with the relevant rules of international humanitarian law (also known as the law of armed conflict). Courses can be arranged at any suitable location worldwide, with host nations/institutions providing in-country facilities and lists of participants.

The costs of travel for the course director and speakers, as well as their payment for delivering the programme, is covered by a generous grant from the Swiss Government.

The courses are delivered by renowned experts in the field of air and missile warfare. They use a combination of lectures/seminars and realistic exercise scenarios to deliver the course material in an accessible fashion. All participants also receive a copy of the Air and Missile War-

fare Manual to retain on completion of the course.

These courses are designed to provide participants with fully up to date information on the subject as well as the skills necessary to deliver similar training to other colleagues as required.

Up to six courses are possible each calendar year and bids should be made to GCSP giving details of the proposed host institution as well as a point of contact.
