➔ Key opportunities

Doctoral Fellows are expected to pursue full-time independent research and writing based on the topic outlined in their proposal, submitted at the time of application.

Global Fellowship Initiative

Doctoral Fellows are part of the GCSP Global Fellowship Initiative, which brings together at the GCSP in Geneva government officials, executives, scholars and young leaders from around the world.

GCSP's Programmes
