Nuclear Disarmament Verification PPAD Graduate course study visit to Oslo (January 2015)

Professor Sameh Aboul Enein, adjunct professor for international security & disarmament at School of Global Affairs and Public Policy, led a study trip in Oslo-Norway in Winter 2015 as a part of PPAD 5198/5199 Nuclear Disarmament Verification (Practicum) course. The course was organized jointly with the Center for Science and Security Studies at King's College London and School of Global Affairs at the American university in Cairo.

Graduate students spent two intensive weeks at GAPP - AUC working on familiarizing themselves with the technical course content including briefings on verification /inspection mechanisms/ types of nuclear weapons,/nuclear fission & material, in addition to the process of warhead dismantlement.

The simulation exercise in Oslo - Norway aimed to examine and develop a better understanding of how verification methods can be applied to reductions in nuclear warheads and ultimately getting rid of them altogether. The exercise sought to train a new generation of students to some of the issues surrounding arms control and disarmament inspections.
